FROM THE BOARD ROOM February 2024 Board Meeting Highlights



Monthly Reports:

The Operations report included the sale of bombardier track machine on the Wisconsin Surplus Auction site. The work plan project in Connorsville is complete and the project on County Road H is nearing completion. Zielies

Tree Service is about 50% done brushing the Wheeler Substation, and right on budget.

The Energy Services report contained updates on building maintenance, evaluation of new load management receivers, and renewable energy accounts. It was also noted that the EV charger at 29 Pines had performance issues during the January cold snap.

The CFO discussed January sales, a small PCA charge passed on by Dairyland Power Cooperative, and summary of Accounts Receivable for the year.

The CEO/General Manager had director Varnes give an update on his first two Certified Credentialed Director

Classes. New directors are required to complete the course in their first 3 years of sitting on the board. There were also some updates on other meetings and seminars attended by staff and directors. A Board Self-evaluation was also discussed and will be scheduled for March.

The following items were approved:

- Capital credit estate payout for deceased members.
- Audit committee report of all checks, ACH payments, wire transfers, credit card statements, and investments accounts.

Other Business:

Director Zwiefelhofer reported on Dairyland Power activities for the month.

Reviewed the monthly report of new Cooperative members. Reviewed the monthly educational piece, "Key Board Traits: Trust, Respect, and Openness."
